Greetings and a Happy Lent to all!

Your Church Council and Call Committee have been very active in this interim period. The Council met several times with members of Kenwood Lutheran Church to discuss a possible future agreement. They also held several congregational meetings after church services to inform our members of where we are heading.

One option we have ahead of us is to meet with Kenwood Lutheran Church to discuss the possibility of entering into a two-point parish agreement with them. We have hired Pastor Mark Holman to provide pastoral leadership at Family of God. Pastor Holman will also preach several Sundays in the coming months and help to guide our teams toward a parish agreement or pastoral call.

The Call Committee has met several times and elicited the help of Council to make progress on our Ministry Site Profile. (MSP). The MSP document will describe our congregation and our focus in ministry and is available to any pastors searching for new ministry call. We hope to have the MSP approved by the end of February. From there it will be sent to the Synod for approval and then published online.

We are grateful to the congregation for their continued prayers and support.

March is almost here and the Minnesota March FoodShare Campaign will began February 26

It will continue until April 6. We want to thank you for your past support. Because of the efforts of groups like yours, the 2023 campaign raised \$91,630 and 69,188 pounds.

Our goal this year is to raise \$100,000 and 50,000 pounds of food to stock our shelves. We can achieve that success in this campaign with your help.

During 2023, the Food Shelf distributed 533,152 pounds of food to 15,781 people in Duluth. Our Food Shelf was a major source of each visiting families nutrition throughout the year. Together we are fulfilling our call to feed the hungry.

So what do we need? More money or more food? We need both! But the Food Shelf can do much more with money. As a member of Second Harvest Food Bank, our money goes much farther than it would shopping at Super One or Cub Foods. For every \$1 that gets donated, we can buy \$3 worth of food -- that is three times more!

CHUM often needs items like: Peanut butter (small 16 oz. jars); canned soup (non cream); canned fruit; vegetables; stew and pasta; fish; beans; pasta; rice; cereal. Specialty foods like olive oil, dressings or marinades can be helpful if they don't need to be refrigerated.

Additionally, CHUM accepts **NEW** personal care and household items since many families struggle to afford them and aren't covered by other food assistance programs.

CHUM **CANNOT** accept: items needing refrigeration; expired food; leftovers; food with packaging concerns (dented or damaged); baked goods.

A big "Thank You" to all who participated in the "Reverse Advent Calendar" to help provide support to those experiencing food insecurity. Things that we all take for granted.

The total weight for food delivered to the Food Shelf was 368 pounds and an additional 28 pounds of peanut butter.

This also included 48 pairs of socks, 27 hats, 32 mittens, four sets of pajamas and two blankets. What a blessing!




Looking Ahead
